Abstracts (maximum of 250 words, in MS Word) must be submitted online via <u>Call for Abstracts</u> by **April 22<sup>nd</sup>**, **2019**. Please provide the following information: name, email address and phone number; for students, please also state your degree program and university. ## **Creating a Poster:**

Each presenter will have a net useable space in portrait/vertical format that measures **6 feet wide x 3 feet high** in which to exhibit their poster.

The boards will be numbered, and each presenter will be assigned a spot.

Posters should be set up between 8:00 am and 9:00 am on Friday, May 3, 2019, and remain on display for the duration of the research day until 3:30 pm.

Poster mounting supplies (Velcro strips) will be supplied on site by a volunteer. Staples, pins, and double-sided tape may not be used.

You may also wish to bring along copies of your summary or abstract to distribute. Be sure to include your complete mailing address and email if you wish to receive additional comments.

Presenters should be available at their poster during the poster assessment period (time TBD) to meet viewers and talk with judges.

## **Paul Corey Award:**

While all participants are encouraged to submit an abstract for the Poster Presentation Session, students and postdoctoral fellows are eligible for the Poster Presentation Award established in recognition of Paul Corey. Three winners will each receive a certificate and a cash prize.
